NHS provides services for students with average or above average intelligence, SLD; such as dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia and language based deficits with auditory and or visual processing disorders and/or sensory/motor deficits/executive functioning. Diagnosis of NLD/NVLD, Asperger's, ADD/ADHD, medical issues such as cancer but also exhibit SLD symptoms along with memory, executive planning & organizational deficits, emotional issues such as school phobia, OCD, anxiety, depression, or low-self-esteem.
